Important instructions to Candidates:

- 1) All questions carry equal marks. Total 100 questions are given.

- 3) The candidate must mention the Question booklet code, Serial number and his/her Roll number in the answer sheet. Otherwise such answer sheet will not be evaluated which should be specially noted. All answers must be given as mentioned in the answer sheet for which read the instructions given at the backside of the answer sheet and should be followed compulsorily.
